**\*CSBG – Community Services Block Grant**

Eligible activities include employment training, job readiness education, emergency services including food, medical, clothing and shelter assistance, family development and information and referral to other service organizations

**\*\*ITSAP – Idaho Telecommunications Service Assistance Program**

Eligible activities include assistance with installation costs for residential basic telephone service and/or monthly costs for basic residential telephone service.

**\*\*TEFAP – The Emergency Food Assistance Program**

Eligible activities include distribution of US Department of Agriculture food commodities.

**\*\*\*WX – Weatherization Assistance Program**

The installed measures include insulation of walls, ceilings and floors; infiltration materials; repair or replacement of heating systems, hot water units, windows and doors and measures addressing the participant's health and safety

**\*\*\*\*LIHEAP – Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program**

Eligible activities include cash assistance with home heating costs, emergency assistance to participants whose health may be threatened due to lack of heat in their home, and assistance with clothing, blankets, temporary shelter, and minor home and heating equipment repair in a Governor-declared state of emergency

**Documentation needed at time of Energy Assistance appointment**

- Names/birthdates for all household members
- Heating Energy Vendor Name/Account number (utility bill)
- Verification of residence address (utility bill)
- Income verification for the previous 3 months (check stubs, SS/SSI award letters, etc)
- Self-employment and seasonal workers are required to provide previous 12 months of income or tax forms for 2008. If you have been receiving unemployment, verification showing history and benefit amounts received (if applicable) must be provided from the Employment office
- At least one household member must be a citizen or legal resident of the United States
