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On April 14, 2008, the Commission issued Order No. 30529 concerning the appropriate disposition of the proceeds from the sale of Idaho Power Company's sulfur dioxide (SO2) emission allowances in calendar year 2007. In its Order, the Commission reserved \$500,000 of the SO2 proceeds to possibly fund an energy education program proposed by the Idaho Energy Education Project (IEEP). On July 16, 2008, the Commission convened a Status Conference so that IEEP and other interested parties could provide more detail about developing energy education programs.

THE STATUS CONFERENCE

At the conference, the Idaho Office of Energy Resources (OER) submitted a proposal for the Commission's consideration. OER indicated that the proposal was prepared in cooperation with the Idaho Department of Education (DOE) and with Idaho Power Company. Under the OER-DOE proposal, the \$500,000 in SO2 proceeds would be divided into two equal amounts. Half of the funds would be used to develop and implement an energy efficiency curriculum for schools. The DOE would ensure that the energy curriculum would meet Idaho educational "standards before implementing a program in K-12 schools statewide." Proposal at 1. During this curriculum phase, DOE will also determine the best school grade(s) in which to implement such a program.

DOE envisions integrating the energy curriculum into classrooms by using the "train-the-trainer" model. Under the OER-DOE proposal, two teachers will be initially selected to develop the curriculum and these teachers would then train up to 30 more teachers per workshop.

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NOTICE OF ADDITIONAL WORKSHOP NOTICE OF MODIFIED PROCEDURE ORDER NO. 30699 The agencies estimate having 30 workshops during a two-year period. *Id.* at 2. The agencies anticipate that administering the education portion of the energy proposal would require 0.8 of a full-time employee (FTE) for the two-year period.

The second part of the OER-DOE proposal would be to make \$250,000 available for schools in Idaho Power's service territory to implement/construct specific energy efficiency projects. Such measures might include conservation (lighting, heating, building construction) projects or energy generation (solar or wind) projects. OER estimates that there are approximately 62 public school districts in Idaho Power's service territory with more than 350 buildings. By augmenting Idaho Power's existing energy efficiency project for schools with the additional \$250,000, OER asserts that the additional funds will produce greater energy savings for participating schools than relying on Idaho Power's existing programs alone. Proposal at 3. OER anticipates that administration of the project component would require 0.5 FTE for one year. The estimated costs for both components are set out below.

The OER Administrator and the Superintendent of Education did answer a few questions before they had to leave the conference because of other commitments.

Given the press for time, Idaho Power did not present a proposal or provide additional detail regarding its existing Community Education Program for schools. Instead, the Company said it was prepared to support whatever the Commission decided. Tr. at 44. The Company does have employees who make presentations at schools in its service territory about utility matters, safety, generation and energy efficiency. Idaho Power also provides funding for energy conservation projects in schools. *Id.* The Company indicated that its existing programs "fit very well with the goals" of the OER-DOE proposal. *Id.*

In reaction to the OER/DOE proposal, participants generally voiced support for energy education and offered constructive criticism of the proposal. Others suggested that the school energy projects should be designed to engage the students at the project schools. Finally,

some participants did express concern about the agencies' estimated administrative costs. Tr. at 61, 64.

NOTICE OF ADDITIONAL WORKSHOP

YOU ARE HEREBY NOTIFIED that the Commission appreciates receiving the OER-DOE proposal. For many of the participants at the Status Conference this was the first opportunity they had to review the OER-DOE proposal. In addition, the Commission and participants have not been briefed on the existing Idaho Power programs. Consequently, the Commission shall convene another workshop on JANUARY 8, 2009 AT 9:30 A.M. IN THE COMMISSION'S HEARING ROOM, 472 WEST WASHINGTON STREET, BOISE, IDAHO. The purpose of the workshop is for Idaho Power to present an overview of its existing energy efficiency education efforts and its energy efficiency programs available to schools. More specifically, Idaho Power shall advise the Commission on the type and scope of its completed and currently underway school education curriculum; the type and scope of its completed and currently underway school conservation/energy projects; and any additions or enhancements to these efforts that it believes could be reasonably accomplished with an infusion of additional funds that would directly benefit energy efficiency education in the classroom. Other parties may also advise the Commission of their positions regarding the OER-DOE proposal or offer other proposals.

YOU ARE FURTHER NOTIFIED that all workshops in this matter will be held in facilities meeting the accessibility requirements of the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA). Persons needing the help of a sign language interpreter or other assistance in order to participate in or to understand testimony and argument at a public hearing may ask the Commission to provide a sign language interpreter or other assistance at the hearing. The proposal and other materials in this case are also available on the Commission's website at www.puc.idaho.gov under "File Room" and "Electric Cases." Click on the case number appearing on the first page of this Notice.

YOU ARE FURTHER NOTIFIED that all proceedings in this case will be held pursuant to the Commission's jurisdiction under Title 61 of the Idaho Code and specifically *Idaho Code* §§ 61-316, 61-502, 61-503, 61-523, and 61-524. The Commission may enter any final Order consistent with its authority under Title 61.

NOTICE OF MODIFIED PROCEDURE

YOU ARE FURTHER NOTIFIED that after the workshop, the Commission will seek written comments on the OER-DOE proposal, other proposals (if presented), and the appropriate disposition of the SO2 proceeds. The Commission has determined that the public interest may not require a formal hearing in this matter and will proceed under Modified Procedure pursuant to Rules 201 through 204 of the Idaho Public Utilities Commission's Rules of Procedure, IDAPA 31.01.01.201 through .204. The Commission notes that Modified Procedure and written comments have proven to be an effective means for obtaining public input and participation.

YOU ARE FURTHER NOTIFIED that any person desiring to state a position on OER-DOE's energy proposal or on the disposition of the SO2 proceeds may file a written comment in support or opposition with the Commission no later than February 5, 2009. The comment must contain a statement of reasons supporting the comment. Persons desiring a hearing must specifically request a hearing in their written comments. IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that a public workshop be convened as set out above. Idaho Power and other interested parties should attend and be prepared to address the questions set out above.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that persons interested in submitting written comments in this docket do so no later than February 5, 2009.
