On July 3, 2017, Rocky Mountain Power applied for a Commission determination on the Company plan to upgrade, or "repower," wind resources, and approval of certain ratemaking treatment. The Company claims that the repowering will increase production, reduce costs, and qualify for federal production tax credits. The Company is requesting binding ratemaking treatment, but no adjustment to customer rates at this time. The Company stresses that the tax benefits depend on the Company gaining regulatory approval by the end of the year.

On July 26, 2017, the Commission issued a Notice of Application and Order setting an intervention deadline of August 8, 2017, and directing Staff to develop a procedural schedule for the processing of this matter. Monsanto, the PacifiCorp Idaho Industrial Customers, and the Idaho Irrigation Pumpers Association timely intervened. After meeting with the parties, and agreeing to a case processing schedule, Staff submitted to the Commission for approval a schedule agreed upon by the parties.

With this Order, we adopt the proposed schedule, and schedule a technical hearing for the parties to testify before the Commission.
