


The development of Fallen Heroes Plaza is supported by the
 City through dedication of land, various goods and services, and
 maintenance. Private money will finance the construction of the
 memorial. The sacrifices made by Idaho first responders have
 benefitted every citizen.

The memorial area will have five 12-foot tall sculptures of public
 safety officers in a circular pattern. Within this circle, a half wall will be
 erected wherein the names of fallen firefighters and police officers will
 be engraved. A memorial wall for donors, and an area for engraved
 pavers, will be featured just outside the circle, lovingly, and with
 reverence, surrounding those fallen heroes.

On September 11, 2008, the City of Coeur d'Alene unveiled the first
 memorial component of the Fallen Heroes Plaza featuring two basalt
 columns representing the twin towers of the World Trade Center and
 an artifact from 'Ground Zero.' A groundbreaking ceremony was also
 held for the final phase at Cherry Hill Park. A sculpture memorial will
 be dedicated to Idaho firefighters and law enforcement officers who
 have died in the line of duty throughout Idaho's history.

Feb 2009 rate increased by	26.7%

If you, the Idaho PUC, grant their new request, our rates will jump to 37% over what they were in Oct of 2008.

Regarding Avista's wanting to increase rates:

1. I understand that this request is, in part, to pay for Avista's advertising. Avista is a monopoly in this region. They have no competition; hence there is no need to advertise. If Avista's management believes advertising is necessary, then Avista must budget for that accordingly without raising its rates.

2. I also understand that rates are to be increased to force Avista users to pay for those customers who will not or cannot pay for their gas and/or electricity. Customers' had always had the choice of contributing to 'Project Share.' It was purely voluntary.

I have to struggle to pay for what I use. Right now I am paying off an overdue bill--my last payment was to have been used to buy groceries. My father had always contributed to 'Project Share,' as had I, when I could afford to do so. Now Avista expects me to pay more when I am working very hard for very little, and paying off my overdue bill as best I can.

Regarding Avista's wanting to increase rates:

1. I understand that this request is, in part, to pay for Avista's advertising. Avista is a monopoly in this region. They have no competition; hence there is no need to advertise. If Avista's management believes advertising is necessary, then Avista must budget for that accordingly without raising its rates.

2. I also understand that rates are to be increased to force Avista users to pay for those customers who will not or cannot pay for their gas and/or electricity. Customers' had always had the choice of contributing to 'Project Share.' It was purely voluntary. Avista has a history of being willing to work with people who stay in contact with them, who make and abide by any payment arrangement, and who promptly notify them of any change affecting their ability to comply with the agreement.

I earn about \$200.00 per week. I maintain contact with Avista, remit payments as agreed, and notify them promptly if the arrangement needs to be modified. Sometimes it means going without something else I need.

If Avista is bent on forcing its customers to pay for everyone else's utilities, let them divide the total amount charged in Idaho by the number of households, then bill each household by the result. At least then we would have an honest representation of the Socialism Avista is proposing.

I have watched for the last few years and it seems Avista amongst other corporations have gotten the impression that they just automatically increase rates every year now. My question is are the rates actually caused by the cost of electricity (buying and selling from other places) or is the increase because the people who work for Avista need a raise. I would like to know what the incomes are of those who are at the top. As we live in such an economy where raises have been typical and we are finding out that in fact it was due to increases in salaries and perks and not in the actual cost of the product it makes me wonder about avista. Also in looking at their rate increase the cost that they are proposing seems to be small however if you take the cost to the public for electricity over the 982 kilowatt-hours its quite substantial. I have never just used 982 kilowatt-hours and my bill shows it as it has more than doubled over the years that Avista has increased their rates. The biggest cost being anything over the what they call average use of electricity. Why isn't this ever shown on their application as anything over 982 kilowatt-hours will cost,xxxx amount of dollars. I think the reason why is because it nearly doubles and that would be out of line and more people would complain.

So I will continue to contest these rate hikes until Avista makes it more clear why the rate hikes, discloses what the hike will be over their average rate (as anything over 982 will raise the bill drastically), and discloses to all just where the money goes.
