A "geographic split" makes more sense to me even if some of us have to change our phone numbers. Changing our phone numbers would be a onetime occurrence to accommodate multiple area codes for Idaho.

I rarely make phone calls outside of Eastern Idaho. As friends, family, and businesses change their phone numbers in our local area, a "geographic overlay" would require consumers to remember 10 digit numbers instead of 7 for any local calls. Why should we now have to remember 10 digit numbers instead of 7 for every dialed phone number in our local area? This doesn't make any sense. The "geographic overlay" is more of a cost savings for the telecommunications providers and does not represent the best interest of the consumer. Please adopt a "geographic split" when more than one area code is needed in the future for Idaho.
