Comment: I am opposed to a geographic overlay of area codes and instead support a split.

I moved from Utah a year ago. The first time Utah adopted a new area code they did a split, but the second time they implemented an overlay. I found the overlay to be frustrating. There's a reason phone numbers have seven digits--it's easier for people to remember and process. It was difficult trying to teach my young children our 10-digit phone number for them to remember. I would much rather have to change my phone number than have to remember and then hand-dial 10 numbers every single time I make a call.

States have been adding area codes through splits for ages and it doesn't seem to have been a problem. People generally have had to change their numbers anytime they moved so this would be nothing new. And I believe all those with cell phones get to keep their numbers anyway.

Please, do a split and keep this easier for us. An initial change is much more palatable than an endless hassle.
