**Re: Notification of DSLnet Communications, LLC, and DIECA Communications, Inc.
Concerning Certain *Pro Forma* Intra-Corporate Transactions --
CONSUMMATION NOTICE AND REQUEST TO CANCEL AUTHORITY**

Dear Ms. Jewell:

DIECA Communications, Inc. d/b/a Covad Communications Company ("DIECA"), on its own behalf and as successor in interest to DSLnet Communications, LLC ("DSLnet," and together with DIECA, the "Parties"), notify the Public Utilities Commission ("Commission") that on December 31, 2011, DSLnet and DIECA completed a *pro forma* transaction whereby DSLnet merged with and into DIECA with DIECA surviving the merger.¹

As a result of the *pro forma* transaction, DSLnet no longer exists as a separate entity, no longer offers services in Idaho and therefore no longer requires its authorizations. As such, the Parties hereby request that the Commission cancel DSLnet's authorizations to provide intrastate telecommunications and rescind any and all tariffs on file with the Commission. In Idaho, DSLnet is authorized to provide service as a CLEC pursuant to Certificate No. 362 issued on September 9, 1999. Because DSLnet does not serve any intrastate telecommunications customers in Idaho, the Company respectfully submits that the surrender of its authorizations is reasonable and necessary and will not be disruptive to the present or future public interest, convenience and necessity.
