On June 4, 2009, Velocity The Greatest Phone Company Ever, Inc. (Velocity) filed an Application for a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity (CPCN) to provide resold local exchange telecommunications services in the State of Idaho. The Application states that the Company intends to provide resold local exchange services utilizing facilities provided by existing local exchange carriers (LECs).

THE APPLICATION

Velocity proposes to provide resold local exchange services throughout the service areas of Qwest North, Qwest South, and Verizon. The Company currently has no plans to install facilities in Idaho. The Company does not intend to provide service to areas serviced by small or rural local exchange carriers.

The Company has not yet initiated resale negotiations. Further, the Company does not intend to collect deposits or require advance payments from customers.

Velocity is incorporated in Delaware, with authorization from the Secretary of State to transact business in the State of Idaho. Although the Company does not have an office located in Idaho, its registered agent for service of process is listed as TCS Corporate Services, Inc., in Boise.

STAFF COMMENTS

Staff reviewed the Application and believes the Company understands and agrees to comply with Commission rules and requirements. Furthermore, the information contained in the Application satisfies the Commission's rules and requirements. *See* Procedural Order No. 26665; IDAPA 31.01.01.111.

Staff believes that the Company possesses the requisite financial, managerial, and technical qualifications necessary to operate as a provider of telecommunications services. Staff,

therefore, recommended approval of the Application for a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity subject to the following: (1) compliance with the Number Pool Administrator and Idaho Commission Order No. 30425 mandating number resource utilization/forecast (NRUF) reporting requirements; (2) contribution to the Idaho Universal Service Fund (USF), Idaho Telecommunications Relay Service (TRS), Idaho Telephone Service Assistance Program (ITSAP), and any future reporting requirements deemed appropriate for competitive telecommunications providers; (3) upon CPCN approval, filing a final and complete price list with the Commission containing all of its rates, terms and conditions and (4) the Company agrees to relinquish its Certificate and any telephone numbers if it is not doing business within one year of its CPCN issuance.

COMMISSION FINDINGS

Based on our review of the filing and the record in this case, the Commission finds that the Company's filing satisfies the requirements of the Commission's Rules and Procedural Order No. 26665. Thus, we approve Velocity's Application for a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity to allow the Company to provide telecommunications services within the State of Idaho subject to compliance with the Number Pool Administrator; contribution to the USF, TRS, and ITSAP; any future reporting requirements deemed appropriate; and relinquishment of its certificate and telephone numbers if the Company is not doing business within one year of its CPCN issuance.

ORDER

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Velocity the Greatest Phone Company Ever, Inc. is granted a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity to provide competitive telecommunications services within the State of Idaho as conditioned in the body of this Order.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that Velocity file a final and complete price list with the Commission containing all of its rates, terms and conditions no later than fourteen (14) days from the service date of this Order.

THIS IS A FINAL ORDER. Any person interested in this Order may petition for reconsideration within twenty-one (21) days of the service date of this Order with regard to any matter decided in this Order. Within seven (7) days after any person has petitioned for reconsideration, any other person may cross-petition for reconsideration. *Idaho Code* §§ 61-626 and 62-619.
